Over \$7 million in Medicines to Haiti

Teva worked intensively to send a sizeable shipment of essential medical products to the victims of the earthquake through several of our humanitarian aid partners now working in Haiti. The \$7 million donation in medicines provided immediate relief, and additional medicines will be sent to meet the tremendous ongoing need of organizations providing health services there. In addition to the medical supplies being donated, Teva is matching employee contributions towards relief efforts.

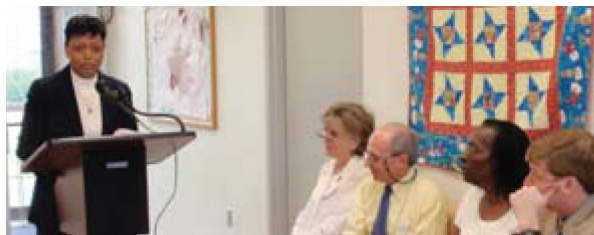
